Gadolinium, 24 Hour, Urine

Reporting Title: Gadolinium, 24 Hr, U

Performing Location: Rochester

Ordering Guidance:

Necessary Information:

24-Hour volume (in milliliters) is required.

Specimen Requirements:

Patient Preparation: High concentrations of gadolinium and iodine are known to interfere with most metal tests. If either gadolinium- or iodine-containing contrast media has been administered, a specimen should not be collected for 96 hours.

Supplies: Urine Tubes, 10 mL (T068)

Container/Tube: Plastic, 10-mL urine tube or clean, plastic aliquot container with no metal cap or glued insert

Specimen Volume: 0.3 mL **Collection Instructions:**

1. Collect urine for 24 hours.

- 2. Refrigerate specimen within 4 hours of completion of 24-hour collection.
- 3. See Metals Analysis Specimen Collection and Transport for complete instructions.
