Setup Guide

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Overview

The MayoACCESS application is an advanced test management solution that connects medical and clinical facilities to laboratories. Using a web browser, the MayoACCESS application provides an efficient ordering, tracking, and reporting system that can be used to perform the following tasks:

- Ordering laboratory tests
- Entering and tracking patient information
- Printing laboratory results for patients
- Printing batch sheets and specimen labels
- Providing important notifications

System Requirements

The following is a list of the recommended and minimum requirements for using the MayoACCESS application.

CPU

Recommended: Core2Duo / Core i{N} / Xeon Minimum: Pentium 4 / Celeron – 1.8 GHz

Recommended: Multiple CPUs / Multi-Cores Minimum: Single CPU / Single Core

Operating System

The MayoACCESS application runs only on the Microsoft Windows operating system.

Windows 10

Recommended: 4 GB RAM Minimum: 2 GB RAM

Web Browser

The MayoACCESS application requires <u>Internet Explorer Version 11</u> or later. Mayo Clinic Laboratories will continue to support Internet Explorer Version 11 until July of 2022. Updated browser recommendations will be provided when they are available.

Internet Explorer Compatibility View Settings

Do not use Internet Explorer compatibility mode on MayoACCESS mmlaccess.com sites.

Turn off compatibility mode from Internet Explorer as follows:

- Press the Alt key to display the Menu bar (or right-click the Address bar and then select Menu bar).
- Click Tools, and then click Compatibility View Settings.

• Ensure that compatibility is **not** turned on for mmlaccess.com.

Applications

The MayoACCESS application requires Adobe Reader Version 11.

Note: Adobe Reader Version 11 works with both 32- and 64-bit Internet Explorer versions. Earlier versions of Adobe Reader work only with 32-bit MeadCo.

High-Speed Internet Access

The recommended Internet speed for using the MayoACCESS application is 4 Mbps or faster. The minimum speed is 1 Mbps. Check the Internet speed by using one of the following websites:

Setting up a Computer for the MayoACCESS Application

To set up a computer to use the MayoACCESS application, you must perform the following tasks for each user on the computer, unless the security policies default these settings for all your computers:

- Add Mayo Clinic Laboratories and the MayoACCESS application as trusted websites
- Install MeadCo ScriptX ActiveX Control
- Set up a label printer

The following topics contain procedures for performing each of these tasks.

Important: You must be logged in to Microsoft Windows as an administrator to perform these tasks.


Note: Ensure that ports 80, 443, and TCP 13000 are open on your firewall to allow communication between the MayoACCESS application and Mayo Clinic Laboratories.

Adding Mayo Clinic Laboratories and the MayoACCESS Application as Trusted Sites

To ensure correct system operation, follow these steps to add Mayo Clinic Laboratories and the MayoACCESS websites as trusted sites:

- Open Internet Explorer.
 Note: The MayoACCESS application requires <u>Internet Explorer Version 11</u> or later.
- 2. On the **Tools** menu, click **Internet Options**.

Note: If the Tools menu is not displayed, you can access Internet Options from the



Settings icon.

- 3. In the Internet Options dialog box, click the **Security** tab.
- 4. On the Security page, click the **Trusted sites** icon and then click **Sites**.

- 7. Click **Close** to close the Trusted sites dialog box.
- 8. Click **OK** to close the Internet Options dialog box.

Note: If you have problems accessing the MayoACCESS application after adding these websites to the list of trusted sites, ensure that Internet Explorer is set to accept cookies.

Installing MeadCo ScriptX ActiveX Control

The MayoACCESS application uses the MeadCo ScriptX ActiveX Control to automatically print certain documents, such as specimen labels.

To install and configure the MeadCo ScriptX ActiveX Control, click <u>https://mmlaccess.com/MACF/LWWEBAPPS/Reports/Scripts/mameadco.htm</u>. After you click the link, the following actions occur:


- The appropriate 32-bit or 64-bit version of the print control is downloaded.
- The ScriptX license is installed for all users that use MayoACCESS from the computer.
- A confirmation message is displayed.

Note: If you are reinstalling the MeadCo ScriptX ActiveX Control, first follow the instructions in <u>Uninstalling MeadCo ScriptX ActiveX Control</u> on page 13, and then click <u>https://mmlaccess.com/MACF/LWWEBAPPS/Reports/Scripts/mameadco.htm</u> to re-install the MeadCo ScriptX ActiveX Control.

Changing ActiveX Settings

If you experience problems running the MayoACCESS application while downloading ActiveX, log out of the application and follow these steps to change the settings for ActiveX:

- 1. Open Internet Explorer.
- 2. On the **Tools** menu, click **Internet Options**.



3. In the Internet Options dialog box, click the **Security** tab.

- 4. On the Security page, click the **Trusted sites** icon.
- 5. Click **Custom level**.

Uninstalling MeadCo ScriptX ActiveX Control

If you are experiencing printing problems, follow these steps to uninstall and then reinstall MeadCo ScriptX ActiveX Control.

To find the MeadCo ScriptX version go to **Manage add-ons** available under the Tools menu. Under **Show:** select **All add-ons** and then look for MeadCo ScriptX. The version should be displayed in the table under the version column or in the lower frame after selecting MeadCo ScriptX.

Note: If the Tools menu is not displayed, you can access Internet Options from the

Settings icon.

If you currently have version 7.0 or later, use Control panel, Add/Remove programs (prior to Windows 7) or Control Panel, Programs and Features (Windows 7 or later) to remove the old MeadCo ScriptX versions.

For versions of MeadCo ScriptX prior to 7.0, use the following directions:

- 1. Download the Cleansx program from the following web page: https://mmlaccess.com/MACF/lwwebapps/classes/cleansx.exe
- 2. If a File Download Security Warning dialog box is shown, click **Run**.

Setting Up Your Label Printer


To print labels, use the Zebra ZD 410 label printer. The printers are provided by Mayo Clinic Laboratories.

The operating system on your computer will locate the driver for the Zebra ZD 410 printer and install it automatically. Then, you can configure the label printer.

Configuring the Label Printer

To configure the printer, complete the following steps:

- 1. Plug the power cord into the printer and then into any AC outlet.
- 2. Use the Universal Serial Bus (USB) cable provided to connect the printer to the computer.
- 3. Turn the printer on.
- 4. Configure the label printer properties for the Zebra ZD410 printer in Microsoft Windows 10, by following these steps:
 - a. Click **Start**, and then click **Settings**.


Creating a Shortcut Icon on the Desktop

You can create a shortcut icon on your computer desktop for quick access to the MayoACCESS application and to Mayo Clinic Laboratories. To create a shortcut icon, follow these steps:

- 1. Right-click anywhere on your computer desktop.
- 2. In the context menu, click **New**, and then click **Shortcut**.



3. On the first page of the Create Shortcut wizard, enter the address for which you want to create a shortcut icon.


Improving Performance

Adjusting Disk Space

For best performance, set Internet Explorer to use between 20 and 50 MB of disk space. To check or change these settings, follow these steps:

- 1. Open Internet Explorer.
- 2. On the **Tools** menu, click **Internet Options**.



Clearing Temporary Internet Files and Cookies

Internet Explorer stores temporary files and cookies for web pages that you visit. However, as the amount of storage used increases, system performance might be decreased. You can clear these files to improve your system performance.

To clear these files, follow these steps:

- 1. Open Internet Explorer.
- 2. On the **Tools** menu, click **Internet Options**.



3. In the Browsing history section of the General page of the Internet Options dialog box, select **Settings**.


Troubleshooting

Disabling Pop-up Blockers

If the MayoACCESS application does not open correctly, it might be necessary to disable pop-up blockers on the computer. To disable pop-up blockers, follow these steps:

- 1. Open Internet Explorer.
- 2. On the Tools menu, click **Internet Options**.



- 3. In the Internet Options dialog box, click the **Privacy** tab.
- 4. On the Privacy page, click **Settings**.
